**ANNE DONEVAN** (Props) From staging a crumbling resort on a Greek Isle to a storm-tossed island in the Caribbean; from a 1940s kitchen to a 50s skid row flower shop, Anne has been "propping up" The Encore for the past 14 seasons. She has scoured the country for unusual and often seemingly impossible items like an early Hollywood makeup kit, an antique dental chair, classic signage and vintage luggage, bagpipes to beer barrels and more. If she can't find it, you will often find her in the shop building it herself! Anne has provided props for more than 60 Encore productions and counting. She says the Rockette/Vienna Choir Boy prop from PLAID TIDINGS still holds the record for the most hours spent on a prop that was needed on stage for mere seconds. "As always, a pleasure to work with such a talented creative team and cast."

**TYLER DRISKILL** (Music Director) is an assistant professor of music in the Department of Musical Theatre at the University of Michigan's SMTD. Having served nearly 20 years as a collaborative pianist for the U-M Departments of Musical Theatre and Dance, Tyler has enjoyed an extensive career as a music director, conductor, arranger, vocal coach, and educator. ## DRAMATURG'S NOTE

l want to tell them words don't matter, but from what l've seen words can get you killed. ~ Mitch Mahoney

How do we use language to express the inexpressible? We sing and dance in musical theatre to move the story forward, but oftentimes we do it to connect with more than just words: music too. It's often the rule in musical theatre that when it's too emotional to speak, you sing; and when it's too emotional to sing, you dance. Our characters transcend the spoken nature of a spelling bee and give us hilariously insightful lyrics, militant dances, and beautiful music.

At first glance, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* is a lighthearted musical comedy simply about a spelling bee with a quirky cast of characters. At second, or third glance, this musical takes us deeper into the throes of childhood and what it means to grow up. It asks us, as the audience, how we grow up in unexpected ways, and now in 2023, how we grow up during unprecedented times.


Each kid in this show has something with which they are trying to wrestle: whether it's their parents, themselves, or something else entirely. They know so many different words: their languages of origin, pronunciations, and spellings. Yet, they struggle most to articulate their feelings, which reveals that in a world reliant on words, we often find them insufficient. What do we use when language isn't enough? I invite you to think in what ways do you express yourself beyond the confines of language? In song, dance, or maybe a home-cooked meal?

No matter how well we learn to express ourselves through unseemly means, we must return to the normalcy of conversation. Everyday we must find the words to communicate. The use of language is a courageous act. It takes patience and care because like Mitch says, "words can get you killed." Words matter.

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


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


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#### Then and Now: The Wonderful Life of Dexter's Historic Copeland Building

Dexter's historic Copeland Building has been a cornerstone of the community since it was built. The beloved structure has been used for many events and services over the decades and has recently received a facelift as it enters the next phase of its illustrious life—home to The Encore Musical Theatre Company.

The Copeland Building was constructed in 1936 as an addition to the Dexter Union School.

The first Dexter Union School was constructed in 1857, on Piety Hill at the corner of Hudson and Ann Arbor streets. Unfortunately, a large crack in the structure brought an early end to its service. The school was torn down, and the second Dexter Union School was constructed in 1887.



In the early 1930s, the school was overcrowded. In 1935, Senator Royal S. Copeland visited Dexter and was appalled at the conditions he found in his alma mater. The Senator began an initiative to build an addition that would remedy the overcrowding and provide a gymnasium. The cost for the expansion was \$94,000, of which \$50,000 came by way of a grant from the Public Works Administration.

The Copeland addition was completed in late 1936 and included a new gymnasium/ auditorium, home economics classroom, office, additional classrooms, and a new ventilation system. The new building was named for Senator Copeland's father, Roscoe Copeland, who served as Village President for 35 years, as well as a number of terms on the school board.

The school experienced an influx of students in the early 1950s when the surrounding country schools closed. Space was again an issue. In 1957, a new high school was built on Baker Road, and the second Dexter Union School was closed. In 1961, the old structure was torn down, but the Copeland Building was renovated into an early elementary school.

More renovations occurred in the late 1970s, and in 1980, the building was named the "Copeland Primary Center," designed for kindergarten and first-grade students. As Dexter's school district expanded with more construction, the Copeland Building was converted into administrative offices and the Dexter Senior Center. The auditorium continued to be used by school and community groups.

As Dexter's schools continued to centralize in one area, by 2019, the administrative offices were moved to the Bates Building in the heart of the campus. Having moved on from the Copeland Building, the school district made plans to sell the building.

Meanwhile, one of Dexter's many crown jewels, The Encore Musical Theatre Company, had outgrown its building behind Hackney Hardware. The Encore secured the necessary financing and purchased the Copeland Building early in 2020 with plans to turn the structure into an entertainment destination and educational center for the performing arts. Renovations began in September that year.

The Encore has retained the building's endearing, historical character, giving it a muchneeded facelift to the interior. A large lobby (with a full bar for pre-glow, intermission, and after-glow times - coming in the near future) is one of the most notable changes. The auditorium has also been reinvented with new sound, lighting, and flexible seating.

Historic buildings often serve as touchstones to our past, reminding us of the character and values of prior generations who passed through the same doorways and walked the same hallways. And as the world continues changing and moving on, something is soothing in the idea that we can adapt but still take the past with us and build upon it, literally and metaphorically.



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
